One of Jesus' great teaching parables involves a sower who cast seed along the ground. The sower hoped the seeds would sprout, grow, and bear good fruit. Some seeds did just that, producing a great harvest. But others, Jesus said, fell among thorns and, though they began to grow, these good plants were quickly choked out. Jesus said the thorns were "the cares of the world and the lure of wealth" (Matthew 13:22).

In a culture where having "enough" seems to have become a never-ending pursuit, Jesus' parable remains incredibly relevant. We live in a society that tells us "you deserve it now," whether or not we can afford it or really even need it. Many of us are chasing the American dream in ways that lead to stress, anxiety, and fear—thorns that can rob us of the ability to enjoy the abundant lives of purpose that God intended for us.

I'm sure we've all struggled with these issues at one time or another. I know that I have. They are important issues that we cannot ignore. This is why, over the course of four weeks, we will have a worship emphasis called *Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity*, based on Rev. Adam Hamilton's book of the same name. We'll explore what the Bible teaches us about financial management. We'll look at what others have learned by working through financial challenges. Each week I'll provide you with some tools from experts you can use to assess your financial situation and develop a financial plan with a biblical foundation.



I hope you will join me in the coming weeks as we look at how we can manage our financial resources and truly experience simplicity, generosity, and joy – in other words, that God is "Enough."





Items for DFG hygiene kits include

- √↓• Colorful cotton panties—girls size 14 or 16, or women's size 5, 6, & 7 (bikinis or briefs) Panties are always the most needed items!*
- Δd Cotton washcloths (The thinner ones are better than heavy ones—colors better than white)
 - Soap (small, hotel size)
 - Grosgrain ribbon- 5/8" wide-pretty colors
 - Thread (polyester, darker colors, regular & serger)



Fabrics* needed:

- 100% cotton flannel for liners
- 100% cotton calico or quilting fabric for shields
- Blend fabrics are OK for bags

*Fabrics should be bright colorful cheerful busy patterns to hide stains. Avoid animal, people, cartoon, pop culture, camouflage, or food patterns. Ideal fabrics are floral or geometric designs in darker or bright colors.


