



"This is love: it is not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son as the sacrifice that deals with our sins. Dear friends, if God loved us this way, we also ought to love each other" (1 John 4:10-11 CEB).

Hannah and I were at Walmart the other day getting groceries. I don't normally pay any attention to the magazines by the cash registers. (I feel like most of the time they're filled with celebrity gossip

and rumors which I don't have the slightest interest in.) However, I noticed a special issue on the story of the RMS Titanic – probably in celebration of the 25th anniversary of the hit film – which caught my eye and had me flipping through in the middle of the checkout line!

Where does the movie *The Titanic* rank in top romantic films of all time? I'll let you be the judge. The story of the Titanic has an important detail that reminded me about love this week. Loving someone means you are listening for an opportunity to love.

Back in 1912, tragedy struck in the Atlantic. The RMS Titanic hit an iceberg and sank three hours later. Thankfully, about 700 people were rescued and pulled to safety on the decks of the RMS Carpathia.

Many wondered how many more lives might have been saved had the SS Californian also come to help. The Carpathia was about 60 miles away when the Titanic called for help. The Californian was only about 6-10 miles away. Why didn't the Californian come to help? Being a quiet night, the radio operator turned off his radio long before the Titanic signaled distress. When the Californian's crew saw flares rising on the horizon, they had no knowledge of the Titanic's turmoil and assumed passengers were having a party.

Loving someone means we are actively listening and actively present. It means waiting and watching for an opportunity to love. Far too often, I'm distracted from loving my wife and my "fur babies." Sports, TV, my iPhone (!), and work can all distract me from being present...actively present. Am I truly present listening to the successes and challenges of my wife's day? Am I noticing when Karl brings me a toy, or the kitties are vying for my attention? If the answer is that I'm at best distracted as I listen to my wife or play with my pets, then I'm missing opportunities to love. I'm not learning how to love.

Our Maker loves us – actively and presently – so much. God knew the desperate situation we were in, and he knew exactly what, or should I say *who*, we needed. Jesus Christ, God's Son, lived a perfect life as a gift to us. And then he took on himself our sinfulness, delivered sin over to death itself, triumphed over evil and death, and established himself as the rightful king of the cosmos, rescuing us and forming with us a new covenant. God did all that in grace because God knew what we needed. God knew and God acted to love us.

Because we know what God did for us through his Son Jesus, we love God. We actively listen to God through prayer in order to love our Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. John Wesley understood a life of prayer as consisting of what's called works of piety and works of mercy. Works of piety include things like reading the Bible, going to church, and receiving communion. Works of mercy are things like offering comfort to others, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and working to change systems that hurt and victimize people.

This month, I hope you will join me in trying to actively listen to and love God. I encourage you to carve out time to set aside the distractions of work and play, devices and news. Sit down with God's Word and invite the Holy Spirit to speak to you. Set aside an extra hour or so on Sunday mornings to actively listen to your Creator. You will find out how much God loved you, loves you and will always love you. You will discover ways to love God that result in blessings for you and your loved ones for generations.

Also this February – and not just February but every month – take your spouse, a friend, or a neighbor on a "date night." One thing Hannah and I are doing is seeing *Romeo and Juliet* at the Gainesville Community Playhouse. Another good idea is to find a quiet restaurant with an out of the way table, turn off the cell phones for an hour, and actively listen to learn how to love her, to love him. \odot

MISSION OF THE MONTH

Bread of the Mighty Food Bank, celebrating 35 years of serving the community, is a private non-profit organization. They collect, sort, store and distribute donated food and basic essentials to 170+ non-profit agency partners such as food pantries, churches, homeless shelters, and other organizations

who then distribute food in their communities to directly feed the hungry.

They have a five-county service area - Alachua, Dixie, Gilchrist, Lafayette, and Levy. They're a Partner Distribution Organization under Feeding America and part of the 12 food-bank networks of Feeding Florida.

Their 25,000 square foot warehouse has 2,600 square feet of cooler and freezer capacity. Thanks to their generous donors, they now have a fleet of ten trucks and vans and five drivers. They're on the road five days a week picking up donated food from generous retailers and wholesalers that in turn gets distributed back to the community.

In an effort to keep perishable and fresh items from sitting in their warehouse, their "Food on the Move" program was established, ensuring fresh and perishable items don't sit in the warehouse and quickly get into the hands of those in need.

For every \$1 donated, Bread of the Mighty Food Bank can provide up to 8 meals. Please donate shelf-stable items. They LOVE to combine your donations to make a complete meal for a family. Pop Tops are wonderful for our families with young children and those families that do not have can openers.


