WESLEY UMC COMMENDED FOR MEETING 100% OF OUR APPORTIONMENTS FOR 2022!

Our unit of the United Women in Faith received a thank-you card from Rev. Catherine Price on behalf of the Conference Committee on Finance and Administration. She personally thanked us and our congregation for giving 100% of our apportionments in 2022. She said that she knows, during these difficult times, that is not accomplished without sacrifice. Our faithful support has made a real difference in the life and ministry of the UWF.

We also received a letter from Craig Smelser, treasurer of the Florida Conference, on the same subject. He also stated that lives are changed because of our steward-ship. He listed a few specifics:

- Children are fed at feeding programs around the world
- Young men and women receive financial assistance towards their calling to become ordained clergy serving the church
- Retreat and camp settings help grow and make disciples of Jesus by offering invitations to go further in the understanding of being a Christian
- New churches are planted
- Existing churches are transformed to better meet the needs of the communities where they are planted

Florida Conference churches met and rose above these challenges and were able to contribute \$13,992,894 in apportionments. Mr. Smelser believes that a sign of a healthy congregation is full support of the rest of the connection. We are the ones who have joy in God's gifts, given in abundance, and who are practicing a spirit of generosity that points to a larger vision of the Church in common mission and ministry to the world.

This is truly a sign of the living God at work in our midst. He offers his wish that the Spirit of God continue to illumine, guide, and empower us to be God's own people.

WISSION OF THE MONTH

We all know they build houses, but that's not all! They also build people! To qualify for home ownership a person must be interviewed by a volunteer Family Selection Committee who looks at issues like a family's financial situation and stability. Prospects must demonstrate a need for safe, affordable housing, have a steady job, and have bills which are less than 40% of their income.

People who qualify for the program then must put in at least 400 hours of sweat equity (200 hours building homes for others and 200 hours building their own homes), must attend classes on home ownership, and must pay an affordable mortgage for 30 to 40 years. Habitat is not a free "give away" program by a long shot!

Habitat was established in 1976 by Millard and Linda Fuller. He was an attorney who gave up his fortune so others could have decent housing, and the initiative has since spread around the world. The Gainesville Chapter started in 1989 and has built more than 100 homes, with more to be finished very soon! Habitat has a ReStore Thrift Shop at 2301 Northwest 6th Street and welcomes volunteers in many capacities, not the least of which is financial! 

THE BELOVED COMMUNITY BOOKCLUB

The next book we'll be discussing in our Beloved Community Book Club is Phoebe: A Story by Paula Gooder. You can purchase the book on Amazon or wherever books are sold. Alternatively, I got notified yesterday that the public library has acquired a couple copies if you've been waiting to go that route. We will meet to discuss the book, July 27th at 7PM.

Sometime around 56 AD, the apostle Paul wrote to the church in Rome. He entrusted this letter to Phoebe, whom he describes as the deacon of the church at Cenchreae and a patron of many. But who was this remarkable woman? Biblical scholar and popular author and speaker Paula Gooder imagines Phoebe's story—who she was, the life she lived, and



her first-century faith—and in doing so opens up Paul's world, giving a sense of the cultural and historical pressures that shaped his thinking and the faith of the early church. After the narrative, Gooder includes an extensive notes section with comments on the historical context, biographical details, cultural practices, and more. Rigorously researched, this is a book for anyone who wants to engage more deeply and imaginatively with Paul's theology.
