

#### **BREAD OF THE MIGHTY FOOD BANK**

Bread of the Mighty Food Bank has been helping to feed Gainesville and surrounding areas for 36 years.

They collect, sort, store and distribute donated food and basic essentials to over 200 nonprofit agency partners such as food pantries and feeding programs. Their dedicated team hits the road five days a week to collect donated food from generous retailers and wholesalers, which is then redistributed back into the community, addressing hunger and supporting those in need throughout Alachua, Gilchrist, Levy, and Union counties.

In May 2023, the organization proudly joined Feeding Northeast Florida as a branch, expanding their reach to collectively serve 12 counties in Northeast and North Central Florida. The collaborative strength and efficiency inherent in this network ensure not only immediate impact but also longterm, enduring success. Together, they strive to make a significant difference in the lives of those they serve, fostering a resilient and nourished community for years to come.

Volunteers are an essential support network to their warehouse staff. They welcome both individual and group volunteers including churches, corporations, students, families, and more. 
